May is ELECTRIC SAFETY MONTH!

Children often do not understand the danger of electricity and electrical equipment. In their innocent and imaginative minds, what can potentially be dangerous may go unnoticed or even appear enticing and fun. Take an opportunity to point out overhead power lines and any other electrical equipment to children and explain what they are.

Safe Electricity recommends teaching children to follow these rules:

- Never climb trees near power lines.
- Kites, drones and model planes should be flown only during good weather conditions in large, open areas, like an open park or a wide field.
- Never climb a utility pole or tower.
- Don't play on or around padmounted electrical equipment.
- Never go into an electric substation.
- Immediately seek shelter if lightning or thunder is present while playing outdoors.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

Routine maintenance is important to keep your refrigerator running efficiently. Lint and dirt should be cleaned from the refrigerator coils every six months to a year, and more often if there are pets in the home.

The additional work can increase the energy costs of the refrigerator by as much as 35% and shorten the life of the appliance.
